

Server Rules

In order to assure a fair division of our server resources among all users, the use of CMASLab's server is subject to the following regulations:

- The use of Trumpfbuur is reserved to focus project students, students not involved in focus projects shall not have access;
- In case of low use of Trumpfbuur, PhDs are allowed to have access to it, but with a lower priority (see below);
- A priority system is to be set up on the Griffins and on Trumpfbuur:
 - on the Griffins PhDs have normal priority while students have a lower priority;
 - on the other side, on Trumpfbuur focus project students have normal priority while PhDs a lower one;
- All supervisors shall encourage their students to use Euler for running their simulations. In case that this is not possible, the supervisors shall contact the IT responsible to discuss the eventuality to give their students access to a server;
- The IT responsible decides on which server the students can work according to available resources (installed software, available disc space, number of users working on the same machines, etc.);
- The supervisors shall communicate to the IT responsible when their students finish their work and/or do not require server access anymore;
- The IT responsible shall communicate to the PhDs the list of students having access to the different servers. This list is available on: public\servers\ Students with server access.xlsx. It is up to the IT responsible to keep this list up to date;
- Users shall not mesh directly on the server. In case this cannot be avoided, the user who needs to mesh shall contact the other users working on the same server to be sure not to hinder somebody's work before proceeding;
- In the same way, in case a user needs to run a heavy simulation, he shall contact the other users working on the same server to be sure not to hinder somebody's work before proceeding. An open and clear communication between PhDs is recommended in order to avoid conflicts for the use of the available resources;
- It is up to the supervisors to explain these rules to their students and to guard on their correct observance.
